Morning Drop-Off for Grades 1 to 8

Parents are asked to observe the 8:00am drop-off time. Students are to enter the building beginning at 8:00am and must be in Campbell Hall ready to begin the day at 8:15am, so that we may begin Morning Prayer, Pledge and Daily Announcements. At the conclusion of Morning Prayer, students will be escorted to the classrooms by the teachers. Parents are asked to refrain from interacting with their children and the teachers once prayer has begun.



Students arriving after 8:15am must enter from the main entrance on 52nd Street and receive a late pass from the school office.

We are firm in using the beginning of Morning Prayer as a school-wide means of determining tardiness. We realize that many families are traveling from a distance, and we understand that sometimes students will be late due to traffic or weather; however, we need a universal means of determining tardiness. Remember that students who are tardy more than three times will not be eligible to receive honors. It is important to arrive on time and to begin the school day together.

Now Serving — Breakfast! For Grades 1 to 8



Breakfast is served in Campbell Hall each morning at 7:30am. Students must enter Campbell Hall from 51st Street and must arrive no later than 7:45am. Students qualified to participate in Free & Reduced Lunch are eligible to receive free or reduced breakfast. The cost for breakfast is \$0.90 per day or \$0.10 reduced. If you would like for your child to participate in the Breakfast program simply drop us a note or call the school office.

Students arriving to school prior to official drop-off time must be enrolled in the Breakfast Program.

Morning Drop-Off for Early Childhood Students

Early Childhood students enrolled in the Breakfast program may enter Campbell Hall from 7:30am to 7:45am. Beginning at 7:45 am, Early Childhood students enrolled in the Breakfast program must enter Campbell Hall from the main entrance of the school on 52nd Street. Breakfast is served until 8:00am. Students enrolled in the Breakfast program arriving after 8:00am will be able to remain with the group, but will not be able to eat breakfast.
